#### **Service Officer Report**

#### **2014 OPEN SEASON CONTINUES**

The 2014 Open Season for the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHBP) and the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) began on November 10 and continues through December 8. All Open Season changes for federal retirees and survivor annuitants are effective January 1, 2015, and premium changes are reflected in February 1, 2015 annuity payments. Open Season changes for current federal employees are effective at the beginning of the first full pay period on or after January 1, 2015.

FEHBP changes may be made online at: <a href="https://www.retireefehb.opm.gov">https://www.retireefehb.opm.gov</a> by selecting "Open Season Online". FEHBP changes may also be made by calling Open Season Express at 1-800-332-9798. During Open Season, federal retirees and survivor annuitants may also request changes and information by regular mail by writing to the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) at: FEHB Open Season Processing Center, P.O. Box 5000, Lawrence, KS, 66046-5000. When using this option, clearly state in writing your Open Season request. If you are making an enrollment change, state the plan you want, the type of coverage (Self Only or Self and Family), and the enrollment code. Remember to include your annuity claim number (CSA or CSF number), and your social security number on your request.

With regard to dental or vision insurance under FEDVIP enrollments, changes, or cancellations may be accomplished by computer at: http://www.benefeds.com or by calling 1-877-888-3337.

There are numerous reference sources available to assist you in determining if you should make any changes during the FEHBP/FEDVIPS Open Season. These include the OPM website, <a href="http://www.opm.gov/healthcare-insurance/healthcare/plan-information">http://www.opm.gov/healthcare-insurance/healthcare/plan-information</a>; the October, November, and December issues of the *narfe* magazine; and the 2015 plan brochure in which you are currently enrolled, Section 2 of which reflects the plan's changes for 2015. Remember, there is no one health, dental, or vision plan which is best for all. However, by doing your homework you will find the plan that best meets your needs.

#### 2015 COLA INCREASE OF 1.7 PERCENT TRIGGERED BY CPI-W RISE

On October 22 the government announced that the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Personnel (CPI-W) was 234.170 in September 2014. This means that the average CPI-W for the third quarter of 2014 (July-September) was 234.242, which is above the 2013 CPI-W third quarter average of 230.327, the base level for determining if a 2015 Cost-Of-Living-Allowance (COLA) would be authorized.

This CPI-W increase means that there will be a COLA for federal retirees and survivor annuitants in 2015. Retirees covered by either the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) or the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) will receive a 1.7 percent increase. Military retirees and Social Security recipients also will receive the 1.7 percent COLA in January 2015.

NARFE-PAC screens requests from politicians for funds. The Legislative Office evaluates how that particular Congressman or Senator has voted on issues important to federal employees and retirees.
