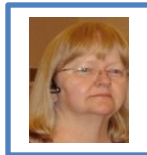

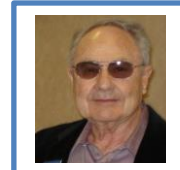

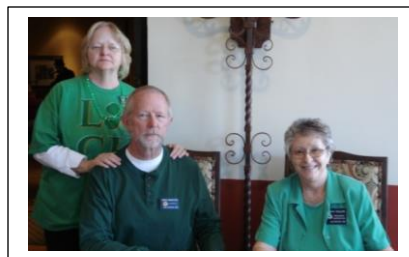

### **JUNE AND JULY CPI-W FIGURES ARE INCONCLUSIVE FOR PREDICTING POSSIBLE COLA INCREASE FOR 2017**

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Personnel (CPI-W), used to determine if Social Security recipients, federal retirees, and survivor annuitants will receive a Cost-Of-Living-Adjustment (COLA) in 2017, showed mixed results for the months of June and July 2016. While the June CPI-W reflected an increase for the fourth straight month, the July CPI-W declined, but is still slightly above the average CPI-W for the third quarter of 2014, the reference point for determining if a 2017 COLA will be authorized.

The June CPI-W was 235.308, a one month increase of 0.37 percent and 0.46 percent higher than the average CPI-W for the third quarter of 2014 (234.242). Conversely, the July CPI-W of 234.789 was 0.22 percent lower than the June CPI-W, but still 0.23 percent higher than the 2014 reference point of 234.242. The CPI-W for August 2016 will be released on September 16.

### **NARFE PROTESTS HUGE PROJECTED PREMIUM INCREASES FOR FEDERAL LONG TERM CARE INSURANCE PROGRAM**

On 18 July the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) announced that most of the approximately 274,000 current federal employees and federal retirees who participate in the Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program (FLTCIP) would see huge increases in their current premiums beginning on 1 November 2016. OPM indicated that the average premium increase would be 83 percent, with some individuals seeing as much as a 126 percent increase. Later in July, Federal Long Term Care Partners, which administers the FLTCIP for the John Hancock Life and Health Insurance Company, the company awarded the long term care program contract by OPM, mailed out individual packets to most of the participants. As an example, your Chapter 182 Service Officer was advised that to retain the current level of coverage, the monthly premium would rise from \$288 dollars to \$517 dollars beginning 1 November. For federal retirees, the premium increase will be reflected in the 1 December annuity payment. Long Term Care Partners did offer the option to reduce or eliminate the premium increase by accepting one of several reduced coverage choices. The deadline for employees and retirees to make a decision is 30 September 2016.

NARFE President Richard Thissen issued a statement of objection which read in part "... I am stunned at the extent of the increase and angry that this type of financial pressure is being placed on federal employees and retirees." Congress has been urged to look into this drastic increase, but there are no guarantees this will occur. Individual NARFE members who will be hit by the jump in premiums may wish to contact their Congressional representatives to voice their concerns.

### **RARE LIFE INSURANCE OPEN SEASON FOR CURRENT FEDERAL EMPLOYEES BEGINS 1 SEPTEMBER**

NARFE members who are current federal employees will be able to take advantage of a rare Open Season for the Federal Employees Group Life Insurance (FEGLI) program which will run from 1-30 September. The last FEGLI Open Season occurred in 2004. The FEGLI Open Season is NOT available for federal retirees and survivor annuitants.

During this Open Season, federal employees will be able to sign up for FEGLI or increase their life insurance coverage. In this Open Season federal employees can make these changes without undergoing a physical exam or filling out a medical questionnaire. Any election made during the Open Season will have a one-year delayed effective date. Coverage changes made during the September Open Season will be effective on the first day of the first full pay period on or after 1 October 2017. NARFE members who are current federal employees should contact their respective agencies for more specific details about the upcoming Open Season.
