Service Officer Report (Jim Kielty)

PASSAGE OF SECURE ACT WILL EXTEND AGE BY WHICH TSP PARTICIPANTS MUST BEGIN TAKING REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS



On December 20, 2019, Congress enacted the SECURE Act which was part of a larger federal appropriations bill signed by the President. The SECURE Act is an acronym which stands for Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE). Most of the provisions in the legislation were directed toward broadening the opportunities for private sector employees to have a 401-K Individual Retirement Account (IRA). However, some sections will apply to the federal Thrift Savings Plan (TSP), which is the federal government's version of a 401-K account.

One major change resulting from the SECURE Act will directly affect certain federal retirees who are participants in the TSP and have not yet reached an age when they are required to begin taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their TSP account under Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations. The SECURE Act has established a new required beginning date for a TSP or other IRA participant to make withdrawals. That date now is April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which the individual attains age 72, rather than April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which the individual reaches age 70 1/2.

Under the SECURE Act, this change became effective for RMDs required to be made after December 31, 2019 with respect to individuals who will reach age 70 1/2 after that date. TSP participants who reach age 70 1/2 in 2020 will not have a required beginning date for withdrawals of April 1, 2021. Anyone turning 70 1/2 in 2020 won't become age 72 until 2021 or 2022, depending on their birth month. This means the first RMD will now have to be taken from the TSP account by either April 1, 2022 (if you reach age 72 in 2021) or by April 1, 2023 (if you reach age 72 in 2022). The 18 month extension of the time an RMD must be taken will allow your money to grow in your TSP account, provided you can afford to leave your money in the account for the longer period.

The federal TSP program has indicated on its website that they are evaluating the impact of the entire SECURE Act on the TSP program and will be issuing additional guidance. NARFE members who are TSP participants are advised to check the TSP website at <u>http://www.tsp.gov</u> or to call TSP at 1-877-968-3778 if they have specific questions.
